On Monday November 2, 2020 at approximately 4:20 p.m. officers from the Cary Police Department responded to Hoffman Park, near the intersection of W. Main St. and Jefferson Ln. for a suspicious incident/battery complaint.

A female reported she was jogging on the path in Hoffman Park when she was approached by a male who was also walking on the path. The female believed the male was signaling to her to stop running, which she did. As she was removing her headphones from her ears to attempt to speak with the male subject, he placed both of his hands on her jacket, below her neck. The woman pushed the man away from her, and she fled the area.

The man is described as East Indian descent, approximately 5'10" tall, 35 to 40 years old, wearing a blue turban and carrying a stick, approximately 18"-24" in one hand.

At this time no charges are pending, however, the Cary Police Department is asking for the public's assistance in identifying the man involved in the incident. Anyone having additional information is encouraged to contact the Cary Police Department at 847-639-2341.
