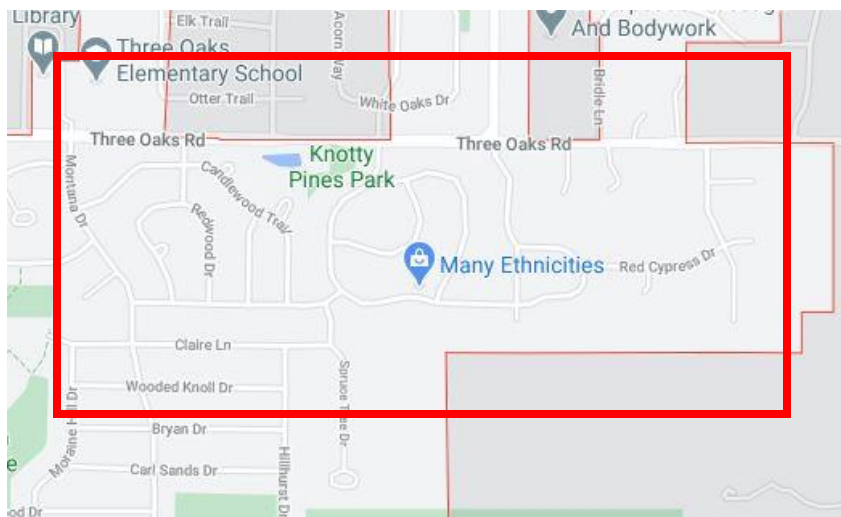

The Cary Police Department is investigating multiple incidents involving intentional criminal damage to motor vehicles that occurred during the evening hours between Friday December 4<sup>th</sup> and Saturday December 5<sup>th</sup>.

Preliminary information indicates at least two subjects were walking through a residential area, approaching vehicles parked outside, and etching words into the vehicle paint with an unknown object. As of Monday December 7<sup>th</sup>, the Department has received approximately 18 reports involving significant damage to vehicles in the same area. It appears the residential streets impacted by these incidents include residential streets bordered by Three Oaks Rd. to the north, Wooded Knoll Dr. to the south, Montana Dr. to the west, and Lyons Ridge Dr. to the east.



Based on video received from residents, it is believed there are at least two offenders involved in these incidents.
