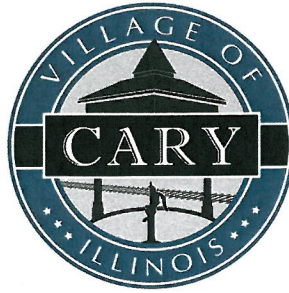

On February 3, 2021, Governor Pritzker and the Illinois Department of Health (IDPH) announced that Region 9 (Lake and McHenry County) moved into Phase 4 of the Restore Illinois Plan. In order to enter Phase 4, regions must have a 7-day rolling average positivity rate of 6.5% or below for three consecutive days, a 7-day rolling average of ICU bed availability of 20% or greater for three consecutive days, and no sustained increase in COVID hospitalizations over the 7-day average for seven of the previous 10 days.

Under the Phase 4 mitigation measures, indoor dining and drinking is now permitted for parties of up to 10 people. Indoor seating must maintain 6 feet distancing between tables. Retail stores, personal care services, and indoor recreation facilities must operate at a capacity limit of no more than 50% occupancy. Social events are limited to 50 people or less or 50% of the room capacity. The McHenry County Department of Health is currently in the process of vaccinating Phase 1A and 1B priority groups. Phase 1A includes health workers and residents of long-term care facilities. Phase 1B includes frontline workers and residents 65 or older. Upon completion of these two phases, vaccinations for residents who fall in Phase 1C will begin. Phase 1C includes residents aged 16 to 64 years old with medical conditions that increase the risk for severe COVID-19 symptoms and other essential workers. Enrollment is now available for those eligible for Phase 1B and Phase 1C. Please visit the Health Department's [website](#) for more information.

The Health Department has launched a COVID-19 call center to assist residents with the vaccine online enrollment process.
